

- BA- 442 JONATHAN J. SCOTT HOUSE (DAVIS-MUTH HOUSE) - 1823 - North side of Belfast Road, 0.3 mile west of Duncan Hill Road. A datestone marked "J.J. Scott, June 2, 1823" establishes age. There is also a 1787 datestone, which is probably from a much smaller house found on the 1798 tax list. In 1873, Thomas H. Scott sold to Evan Davis of nearby Davisville. The house suffered a fire early in the 20th Century. Stone, 2-½ story house with gable roof; dormers; two bays wide; in vernacular, almost primitive style. Log joists in cellar. Owner: Cecelia S. Bosley.
- BA- 442A JONATHAN J. SCOTT HOUSE BARN - Stone walls survive from a large bank barn that lost its wooden superstructure in a fire in mid-20th Century.
- BA- 442B JONATHAN J. SCOTT HOUSE 2-STORY SPRINGHOUSE - Two-story stone structure with dairy room in ground level, smokehouse above. Loft rafters, half-lapped and pegged at the ridge.
- BA- 442C JONATHAN J. SCOTT HOUSE PRIVY - Stone, shed-roofed structure attached to east end of unexplained outbuilding. Two accommodations.
- BA- 442D JONATHAN J. SCOTT HOUSE OUTBUILDING - Northeast of dairy-smokehouse is a one-story, two-bay, stone outbuilding, its original purpose not known. Two wide board doors in south (or main) facade; also small windows. Shed-roofed woodshed tacked on west end; privy (BA 442C) on east.
