This house, located on the north side of Belfast Road west of Duncan Hill Road, commenced as a small but substantial farm dwelling. Through the years, modest additions continued the scale of the original structure. The land where Margaret's Delight is located belonged to Nathan Ensor in the 1820's when the dwelling appears to have been built. The record of this house has not been discovered among early tax records, however. The 1850 map of Baltimore County shows Sally Ensor living here and the 1877 map shows the owner as William Duncan for whom Duncan Hill Road was named.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Margaret's Delight is a two story stone and wood house the stone portions traditionally considered the older, probably dating from 1815-1830. Three bays in length, it now forms a rear wing extending north behind the wooden portion. The front portion of the house, probably dating from 1850-1870, facing south, is three bays in length in the first story, expressed as two in the second. The principle entrance to the house is in the east bay. A one story frame hyphen of recent construction extending to the east links the main portion of the house to a one and one-half story frame structure, its orientation slightly askew from that of the house itself. Said to be an early outbuilding, its new interior finishes obscure structural details which might identify its age; it is on a concrete block foundation.

A stone chimney with a brick stack or extension above the roof ridge rises flush with the south end of the stone wing. On the east side of that wing, in the central bay of the first story, was a door, now altered as a window. The central bay of the west side is void of openings.

Windows throughout are, generally, 6/6. All wood walls are covered with aluminum siding.

Extensive interior refinishings, generally compatible with this simple dwelling, make detailed analysis difficult. In the south wood section, adjacent to the stone, is an open stair in the northeast corner; its walnut oval rail is supported by a boldly turned walnut newel and tapered round balusters. Formerly the easterly bay of this section was a hall but the partition between the hall and the room to the west has been removed. The log rafters are mitered at the ridge.

Question #7 Description, Continued

The northerly bay of the stone section is a small room while the two southerly bays comprise a second room. A fireplace of modern construction, probably in its original location, is at the south end, an enclosed winding stair up adjacent on the west. A niche in the gable end above the stair suggests a former window, blocked by the addition to the south. Exposed joists are of hewn timbers.

A stone spring house stands southeast of the house, its gabled roof cantilevered over its north wall to shelter the spring and areaway in the hillside; small windows are in the east and west sides.
