VAUX HALL SITE - c. 1800 - North side of Paper Mill Road, 0.3 mile east of NCRB right-of-way. Very large, 3-segment, 2-½ story stone house with gable roofing; stuccoed over; the right wing had been built first, then the left, and finally the center block. Put up by Charles Jessop, Revolutionary soldier and early convert to Methodism, ironmaster, mill owner, and contractor on the building of the York Turnpike. Demolished in 1940 when owned by Bureau of Water Supply. It had been Mrs. Mary Jessop's in 1877 atlas. In the 1980s, Andrew Clemens identified foundations that may be remains of outbuildings. Also, an old cemetery.
