ANN PATTERSON HOUSE - Before 1877 - 126 Pleasant Hill Road, second house west of Featherbed Lane in Belltown. Small, two-story frame house, gable roof, yellow aluminum siding, vernacular style, excellent condition. Owner: Paul G. Patterson.

3- 667

MERRYMAN-BELL HOUSE - Before 1877 - 137 Pleasant Hill Road, southeast corner with Church Road. The oldest house of the area, owned at one time by the Bell family who gave name of Belltown to community. Shown as J. Trout's in 1877 atlas and D. Norris's in 1915 Bromley atlas. Frame and clapboard house, two stories, five bays wide; painted white; vernacular style. Victorian scroll-sawn porch railing. Asphalt roofing material, gable roof. One inside chimney, and on the west, one inside end-chimney. House built in two segments: east (2 bays) and west (3 bays); porch across three west bays. Red frame stable to southwest. Owner: George W. Gamber. Being re-habbed, June 10, 1986.

MOSES HALL HOUSE - Before 1915 - 14 Church Road, east side, first house north of Pleasant Hill Road. Shown as H. Clark house in 1915 atlas. Demolished not long before visit of April 13, 1978; a frame stable (white) survived along with a concrete front porch. Owner: Thomas H. Featherston.

DR. RIDER HOUSE - Before 1898 - No. 36-38 Church Lane, east side, 0.8 mile south of Delight Road. Large frame and clapboard Queen Anne style, 2- $\frac{1}{2}$ story house with three dormers; three bays wide; double sash windows in center bay on second story; painted white; gable roof; well back from the road; excellent condition; spacious grounds. Apparently the H. Strewing house of 1898 and 1915 Bromley atlases. Owner: Dr. William B. Rider.

6- 670

OLD LOG HOUSE - 18__ - 1 Church Road, west side, in Belltown, opposite right-angle bend in Pleasant Hill Road. In 1973, house was reported in path of proposed

alignment of relocated U.S. 140, but plan was later revised. Small, one-story, frame vernacular style house, clapboard or siding-covering over logs. Gable roof; modern entrance wing on south. Excellent condition. Owner: Jesse K. Ducoane.

6- 671

OLD LOG HOUSE - Before 1877 - 204 Pleasant Hill Road, south of its right-angle bend. Possibly the D.L. Slade house of the 1877 atlas. Originally a log house, this frame structure is now covered with clapboard. Two stories, gable roof, vernacular style. Three bays in second story, four bays on first, including off-center door. Excellent condition. Owner: Richard E. Lee.
