Rectangular, two story, three bay, frame with composition shingle siding, side gable, balloon frame, detached dwelling with Gothic Revival cross gable with round-arched windows, two story ell and single story modern wrap around addition. The wrap-around addition incorporates a modern wooded primary entry door, a sliding glass door and two banks modern louvered windows. Other alterations include the refenestration of the gable end of the ell.

The alterations described above have irrevocably compromised the historic character of this mid-nineteenth century, vernacular dwelling with Gothic Revival features.

One of three Gary houses shown on the G. M. Hopkins' 1877 Atlas of Baltimore County, this house was owned by W. Ziegler as recorded on George and Walter Bromley's Atlas of Baltimore County of 1898. This small, vernacular house with Gothic Revival features is a good example of a common mid-nineteenth century house type. However, its integrity has been compromised and thus its significance undetermined, as a result of incompatible twentieth century alterations and additions.


