DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Richard L. Beard House is a two storey frame house three bays in length, its principal facade to the east. Extending west behind its south end is a two storey frame wing two long bays in length. The absence of any structural joint indicates that the house and wing were built at the same time. A one-storey shed-roofed porch extends across the north side of the wing and its westerly bay is enclosed as a pantry. A one-storey hipped-roofed porch extends across its principal (east) front. Single-flue brick chimneys rise internally at the north end of the main house and at the mid-point of the rear wing. The gabled roofs, which extend equally beyond all walls, are covered with standing-seam tin. Walls are covered with German siding. The principal entrance, in the south bay of the east front, is surrounded by sidelights and a transom. Windows are 2/2 with narrow beaded frames and louvred blinds. In each gable end two small four-light casements light the unfinished attic.

The south bay of the main house contains a hall with an open stair to the second floor. The walnut rail is supported by a boldly-turned walnut newel and by turned chestnut balusters. Step ends are scrolled. A parlor is north of the hall and the rear wing contains two rooms, the last being the kitchen. Fireplaces, probably stove enclosures originally, are in the parlor and the easterly room of the wing; their wood mantels are embellished with molded and incised decoration.
