VALLEY VIEW FARM - 1875-1900 - Northwest side of Garrett Road, Vernon vicinity. The John Almony house shown in 1877 atlas burned and was replaced by the William Cummings house of the 1915 atlas. Large, 2-½ story Victorian style house of frame and clapboard, 5 bays wide, with cross-gable in a projecting pavilion. Two large dormers. Round-topped window in gable peak. Full-width screened front porch. Rear wing of frame. Outside end-chimneys. Set on hilltop. Good condition. Owner:

FRANK ALMONY HOUSE - 1850-1852 - North side of Garrett Road, 0.2 mile southwest of Old York Road, Shane vicinity. Stone house that has always been in possession of Almony family. Built about 1850-52 as proved by Almony family letters. Shown in 1877 atlas as H.W. Almony's. Two stories (plus attic) house, 3 bays wide, with gable roof, small windows in gable ends; inside end-chimneys, stone rear wing; full-width front porch with shed roof supported by square wooden columns. HENRY STABLER'S STORE AND POST OFFICE - Before 1850 - North side of Stablersville Road, Stablersville. Shown as G. Stabler's store on 1850 map and as Mrs. E.A. Price's in 1877 atlas. Stablersville post office was established 1853. Also owned by Wilsons, Wrights. The "store" now resembles a vernacular style dwelling. Two front doors; shelving inside front room. The main, commercial building, is four bays wide, two stories of frame covered with aluminum siding. At the rear is a two-story log kitchen wing. Gable roofing on both sections. Also a stone springhouse. Owners: Mr. and Mrs. Charles F. Ritter.

STABLER'S SCHOOL - 1862 - Stablersville Road, north side, just southwest of Stabler's Church. Built on a lot acquired in 1862 from Daniel Stabler and first shown in 1877 atlas. Small brick building in functional style, stone foundation, gable roof. It was designed with a vestibule featuring double round-topped doors and small open belfry. Two bays deep. Lot now merged with a large adjoining farm, the school having been sold as surplus in 1927 to Edwin G. Turnbaugh. Owner: Mary L. Turnbaugh.
