10911 FALLS ROADJOHN LONG, JR. HOUSE

Although 10911 is less ornate than its immediate neighbor 10901, it is a good example of Victorian architecture featuring cross gables and lattice work. Its west facade is quite similar to the south facade of 10901 Falls Road and evidence points to its existence by at least the 1890's. The property that the house is on is part of the large tract belonging to Stephen Cockey in the 1800's.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The two storey white frame house with the gable roof that stands at 10911 Falls Road has a stone block foundation and 2 corbelled interior end chimnies.

The cross gable west facade is 3 bays wide with a flat roof porch which is supported by 4 wood posts and 4 brick piers pierced with lattice boarding. The wood paneled door in the center bay of the first storey has a 2 light transom and 1/1 sidelights. The windows in the north and south bays are double hung with 2/2 lights as are the windows in the north, center, and south bays of the second storey. These windows have decorative wood pediments above the window frame. The gable holds a 2/2 light modified lancet arch window.

The south facade is 2 bays deep, with double hung 2/2 lights windows in the first storey and 2 closed up windows in the basement. The second storey is windowless.

The first and second stories of the north facade are windowless with only the basement having 2 windows. (which were with closed shutters.)

The east facade has a hipped roof porch on the south half of the first storey and an enclosure on the north half. There is a 2/2 double hung window with shutters in the south bay of the first storey in the south half and a pedimented door in the central bay. The wood enclosure in the north half has a door facing south and a 6/6 light double hung window in the north bay. The 3 2/2 light double hung windows in the second storey have wood pediments and green shutters. There is a 2/2 light double hung window with shutters in the south bay of the south half of the basement and a door in the center bay. The basement of the enclosure has a cement foundation and houses two, 2 light windows.

To the southeast of the house there is a gable roof board and batten garage that stands on stone piers. This garage was possibly a bank barn at one time.


