DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The KAPLAN HOUSE is a frame house, two and one-half storeys in height, three bays in length in the Colonial Revival style built in the early twentieth century. Its principal facade is to the east. A one-storey porch extends across that facade and around each end as well, stopping at a short two storey wing off the northwest corner. A one storey wing extends west behind the northwest wing and a small two storey wing extends west from the south end of the west facade. All roofs except the last are gabled; the roof of the southwest wing is flat.

The principal entrance is centered in the east front; 18/18 windows are in the first storey, 12/12 in the second and all windows have louvred blinds. Three dormers are in the roof, each with a smaller 12/12 window.

A hall extends through the center bay of the house and the open stair rises from the west. The round rail is supported by three plain rectangular balusters per tread and it terminates at the bottom in a scroll. A paneled wainscot surrounds the hall. Two rooms are south of the hall, the southeasterly one having a brick fireplace centered in its south wall; the southwesterly room extends into the southwest wing, probably an addition. North of the hall is the dining room to the east, the kitchen and pantries to the northwest. Typical trim is routed with small corner blocks. The circular-sawn framing is exposed in the cellar.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The KAPLAN HOUSE is an early twentieth century example of the Colonial Revival which originated with the Centennial of 1876; this example is a rather accurate interpretation of the 18th century American Architecture. The house lies on a tract of land which William W. Elder recieved in a deed of partition dated July 8, .1907 between Susan G. Elder, widow of Robert North Elder, and their seven children.(315/503) This particular piece of property was described as lot number 4.(315/505) The house on the property first appears in the tax assesment rolls of 1911 assessed at 5,000\$. Mr, and Mrs, Theodore Kaplan bought the house from Mr. and Mrs, Laurence K. Harper in the late 1970's (5931/20)
