DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The KNOLL is a two and one-half story frame house dating from the last decade of the nineteenth century. Its entrance is in the southwest corner of the west facade, a facade beneath the wide gable of the steep roof above a house which is deeper than wide. The south facade is four bays wide and a large gable rises above the two central bays which project slightly forward in the second story. A one-story porch extends across the south facade and the southerly parts of the east and west sides as well. A rear kitchen wing, extending to the north, is two bays in length, its west side sheltered by two stories of porches. Exterior walls are covered with wooden shingles, stained a dark brown in the first two stories and painted white in the gables. Typical windows are 2/2 with louvred blinds. A window beside the principal entrance, and one above to the north, midway in the wall to mark the stair landing within, has small square panes surrounding a single larger one in each sash.

Within the main section of the house are four principal spaces. The southwesterly is the entrance and stair hall and the stair rises open, with an intermediate landing in each story, to the third floor, its moulded rail supported by massive paneled newels and turned balusters rising above a closed string. A pair of parlors, connected by sliding doors, occupies the east side of the house and a library is in the northwest quadrant. Each space has a fireplace, each with an original mantel of ornamental, naturally-finished oak surrounding decorative tiles. Other interior woodwork is original including the doors, door and window trim with cornerblocks, chair rails and baseboards and it is made of cypress.

Between the rear parlor or dining room and the kitchen in the north wing is a butler's pantry; it and the kitchen beyond contain original cabinetwork.

The second floor plan is similar, with rooms reduced slightly to provide a narrow central hall and a bathroom at the northeast corner, probably an original space.

This house was probably constructed with hot-air central heating and each room retains an original round floor register with a decorative cast-iron grille, a duct system still in use.

Immediately north of the house is a small one-story outbuilding covering the well and containing the pump.
