DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

WILLOWBROOK (Naylor's) is a two storey stone dwelling designed by Eben Dickey Finney, Architect, Baltimore, and built in 1932. With its principal facade to the south, the center block is four bays in length; a three-bay wing extends to the east and another of two bays extends to the west, the latter with another wing extending to the rear or north. The general form, details and materials recall distinguished farmhouses of south-eastern Pennsylvania dating from the late eighteenth century.

WILLOWBROOK

Willowbrook was built in 1932 on part of the original Cliffeholme property by Dr. George Gross Finney and his wife Josephine Lurman Stewart.¹ George Finney commanded a Johns Hopkins Medical Unit during World War II; was a Trustee of Princeton University, Chief of Surgery of the Union Memorial Hospital, President of the Southern Surgical Society and Chairman of the Board of Governors of the American College of Surgeons.²

In 1962, the ownership of Willowbrook passed on to a son, Redmond Conyngham Stewart Finney and his wife Jeannette Sheldon Brown.³ They lived there for eight years until Redmond became the Headmaster of Gilman School.

The present owners are Lawrence Plummer Naylor III and his wife, Cassandra Morris Stewart, who acquired the house in 1969.⁴




