DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The STEWART HOUSE is a very simple two storey frame house, five bays in length, its principal facade to the east. It dates from ca. 1875.

An original two storey wing extends one bay in length behind the north end, a later and lower two storey wing extends two additional bays and finally a one storey wing extends another two bays. A one-storey shed-roofed porch along the south side of the rear wing is now enclosed as service space. Original windows remain throughout the original section of the house, 2/2 with narrow frames and louvred blinds. Exterior walls are covered with wood shingles. A modern exterior chimney is at the south end, replacing an original chimney which was a single interior flue like that at the west end of the original section of the west wing. The gabled roof rises above a plain cornice with bold eave returns at gable ends.

Originally a center hall contained the principal staircase. The staircase and south partition is now removed and the hall is open to the south room. Although the south chimney is modern the mantel appears to be the original with plain pilasters supporting a plain frieze and plain thick shelf. Window trim is modern. A dining room is north of the former center hall, with modern trim and chair rail. An enclosed stair west of the dining room was the secondary stair; it is now the only stair. Original corner block trim remains in the second storey.

The attic is not accessible for inspection. The poured concrete foundation suggests massive replacement of original materials or a relocation of the house on a new cellar. The circular sawn framing, visible in the cellar, is fastened with cut nails.
