The Green Spring Valley School was built shortly after the Baltimore County School Commissioners bought the $\frac{1}{2}$ acre lot from Reuben Stump in 1872. The building, a two story gabled structure resting on a fieldstone foundation, is an excellent example of a local country school house and serves as a document of the type of architectural environment in which children studied in the late 19th century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Green Spring Valley School is a two story gable-end residence resting on a fieldstone foundation. The building measures three bays wide and one bay deep and is covered on the main facade with a single story shed roof porch. There have been several alterations including the fenestration on the first level of the main facade and the exterior wall siding which is presently aluminum.

The interior was not examined.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Green Spring Valley School was built shortly after the Baltimore County School Commissioners bought the 1/2 acre lot from Reuben Stump in 1872. It is reported to have been the replacement for a log school house known as "School Number Seven".¹

The building is an excellent example of a local country school house and serves as a document of the type of architectural environment in which children studied in the late 19th century.
