GEORGE RIES HOUSE # 2

This house was one of three dwellings, which along with a paint shop, blacksmith shop and wheelwright shop made up the estate of George Ries, a man who owned three lots along present day Cedar Avenue from 1853 until 1901. Cedar Avenue was formerly the Old York Road and was once part of the main road through Towson before the York Turnpike Road was constructed in 1799.

This frame structure was built between 1876 and 1896 and is a good example of vernacular Victorian era construction.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This house is one of two built by George Ries between the years 1876 and 1896 where it appears on the tax list of that year.

The two story frame structure has an L-plan, is topped with a gable-end roof and rests on a stone foundation. It measures four uneven bays wide by two bays deep with a two story addition. The fenestration is a regular 6/6 sash. The walls are covered with wooden shingles.

On the east facade there is a four bay single story wrap-around porch which is enclosed on both ends. The porch roof is supported by truncated rectangular columns chamfered on the corners, and has a tongue-and-groove ceiling.

The southernmost two bays contain dissimilar entrances. The third bay is enclosed and the fourth contains a 6/6 sash window. The distance between the third and fourth bays is approximately 3 feet greater than the others relative to the chimney stack. There is a depression in the ridge at this same point.

The south facade is partially covered by a one story addition. The second story has a windowless east bay, and there is a four light casement window venting the attic. This window has an awkward relation to the brick corbeled interior end chimney.

A west wing occupies the southern one-half of the west facade. An interior flue chimney occupies the northwest corner exiting next to the eaves, and the upper story is blind.

The single story ell has a porch enclosure with both casement and sash windows.

The north end has a small shed-roof enclosure on the first level. The upper level is blind in the west bay only. A 6/6 sash vents the attic level of the gable end.

There was no interior access.

A two car frame garage stands 20 feet from the northwest corner of the house. It is also covered with wooden shingles and has a gable end roof.



Lot # 3:


