DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The **NORMAN HOUSE** is a two and one-half story stone house covered with stucco dating from ca. 1815-1830. Oriented to the road, its principal front is to the west and a service wing extends to the east. A large gable with an Italianate double window was added to the front slope of the roof in the mid-nineteenth century, a porch was added in the same style across that facade and the service wing was raised to its present two stories. Virtually all the original interior detailing remains, traditional in concept but delicate in proportion, characteristic of its early nineteenth century period. Its moderately-rich ornamentation reflects the prosperity of its builder.

A stone smoke house is immediately south of the kitchen wing contemporary with the dwelling itself, and a frame carriage house is east of the dwelling. A tenant house is south of the drive between the carriage house and the dwelling.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The NORMAN HOUSE is the substantial stone house of a prosperous country physician dating from the very early nineteenth century, ca. 1815-1830, hence one of the older houses in this Historic District. It retains virtually all of its original well-executed detailing with touches of slightly later periods in its Italianate attic gable and west-front porch. Several structures remain of the many which were required to support nineteenth century rural life.

Lawson's Manor, 152 acres, was surveyed for John Lawson 12/25/1743. Larkin H. Smith purchased 38 acres at the north end from Dr. James Stuart 5/15/1817. Smith was buying and selling property all his life, so it is doubtful that he built a house there for himself. He may have built for his daughter and her husband, Dr. Smauel Lee Moores, to whom he transferred his property in 1822. Dr. Moores practiced there until his death about 1863. His son, of the same name, practiced there until 1866 when he sold to Robert H. Piper. The Piper family lived there until 1893. Another long-time resident was George Morgan who bought the place in 1914 when the City took his mill on Morgan Mill Road for Loch Raven Reservoir.






