

Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

The Dr. Calder Little House is a 2½-story wood frame Queen Anne style house constructed on a masonry wall foundation. The house has an irregular plan and measures five bays by two bays. There are two brick interior chimneys and the house has a wrap-around hip-roof porch. There is a side shed roof addition and a bay window in the east side of the house. The house has gable dormers in its principal façade and there is spindlework in the dormers and front cross gable. The windows are wood double hung sash (2/2 lights) and the roof is clad by slate shingles and there are metal snow guards; the house is clad by fishscale shingles. There is a detached garage in the rear of the house. The house is set back from Everett Road and is surrounded on all sides by pasture and agricultural fields.

According to MIHP form completed for the property in 1980, the house was built in ca. 1905. The property appears to be eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion A because of its association with the dominant agricultural economy that thrived in rural Baltimore County during the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. The resource is a good example of Queen Anne architecture and therefore the property appears to be eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C.


