

WIER-HUBER HOUSE - 1894 - 604 Chestnut Avenue, Towson. The new house for C. H. Wier in Sherwood, Baltimore County, was reported to have been designed by Thomas C. Kennedy, architect, Daily Record, August 25, 1894, p. 190, col. 2.

The house was shown on the west side of Wier Avenue in the 1915 Bromley atlas, Plate 21. The 1898 atlas version (Plate 17) had also shown the Wier House called "Hawthorn" and labeled the road as "Chales Street Avenue."

This frame house is set well back from the road and shrouded in shrubbery. Built in frame and clapboard, it is a late Queen Anne style structure with large dormers and an oval window. The owners listed in 1991 were Erwin W. and Frances F. Huber; the parcel is 851 feet SW of Joppa Road. The entire vicinity was called Chestnut Summit in the 1877 Hopkins atlas. (Tax Map 59, Grid 6, Parcel P367; deeds 5357:15).
