

SHANKLIN-COOPER HOUSE - 1900 - 100 Burke Avenue, Towson. Frame and clapboard Queen Anne style house with some opalescent and stained glass panes in windows. Octagonal corner tower. Located at the NE corner of Burke and Maryland Avenues. The house was built for Arthur P. Shanklin, who had acquired the lot in February, 1900. The house is found in the 1911 tax ledger. Long owned by the Cooper family, including the present owners, Dr. Donald Dwight Cooper and Mrs. Mary M. Cooper. A large frame stable stood on the property and featured broad sliding doors, a level for hay storage, and a square cupola with louvered ventilators. That stable burned on the night of June 18, 1987.
