In upper Caroline County stands the only round barn surviving on the Eastern Shore of Maryland. Its frame is fastened with nails and bolts and covered with vertical tongue and groove boards. At the apex of the roof is a cupola. At the tops of the walls is an overlay of sawtooth boards which is the only decorative feature of the building.

The barn is a curious and unique form of agricultural building which provokes the question of why. Could it be that the builder was influenced by the philosophy of the Shakers who originated the idea, or was he a re-located Wisconsinite?

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Round Barn is located on Zion Road, approximately one mile southeast of Kane Crossroads, Caroline County, Maryland. It is a late nineteenth century agricultural structure that is currently not in use, and is in a badly deteriorated condition.

A two story frame structure, the Round Barn has a shingled conical-shaped roof with a central cupola. The framing system has twenty posts around the circumference of the barn, with a central row of four posts flanked by a pair of posts on each side. The roof frame has a central post to which all of the rafters are connected and extend, teepee-fashion, to the sills where their shaped ends slightly protrude. The exterior cladding of the barn is vertical siding of beaded tongue and groove boards. The siding is attached with nails and bolts, and has an ornamental sawtooth overlay on the upper sections of the barn and cupola. The whole structure is constructed around a concrete foundation.

The north side of the structure has a large wagon door, while two other doorways existed, one each on the south and southeast sides. Several windows are scattered around the barn on the first and second floors. Access to the second floor from the interior was by vertical ladders built on the side walls. The barn seems to have been mainly a storage area, and there appears no functional reason for its being round.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Round Barn is an unusual agricultural structure, yet its proportions and conceptual design are aesthetically pleasing. There appears to be no functional reason for its round floor plan and this, plus the use of ornamentation on the barn, suggests that it was constructed as such for its decorative effect. Therefore, the Round Barn marks a seldom revealed whimsical side of the region's agrarian heritage.
