The Plains of Benjamin Sylvester (Site)

Circa 1870's

Semi-public

The Plains was constructed by Mary Purnell Bourne on property inherited from her grandfather, Benjamin Sylvester, who built and resided at White Hall (now Oak Lawn) in the last quarter of the eighteenth century. The Plains was constructed around 1870 as a summer house, but it also possessed many barns and outbuildings of the period. A blend of the "Stick" and Italianate Styles, the house was very well developed with conveniences of the period. It was demolished in the 1970's.

The estate was purchased from Mrs. Bourne's heir, one time editor of the North American Review, Allen Thorndike Rice, by the Sisters of St. Benedict. An academy for educating young women was operated between 1896-1958. It was superseded by the Benedictine School, a facility dedicated to the education and training of the mentally handicapped.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Plains of Benjamin Silvester was destroyed by the Benedictine Sisters in the early 1970's. It had been located at St. Gertrude's Academy Benedictine School on Maryland Route 312, .4 mile north of Sparks Road, in the vicinity of Ridgely, Caroline County. Before the demolition of the building, the furnishings and some architectural artifacts were dispersed at a public auction.

Pictures of the frame house show that it was an excellent example of the Victorian style in Caroline County. Particularly appealing is the country interpretations of the exterior ornamentation and wood trim.

Swepson Earle states in Maryland's Colonial Eastern Shore that Mrs. Mary M. Bourne built The Plains, a magnificent summer house, on property that she inherited from her grandfather, Benjamin Silvester. After her death it was converted into St. Gertrude's Convent of the Benedictine Sisters.


