**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

Long Point farm is located two miles south of Hillsboro at the place designated Wayman Wharf on the County Map (1961, U.S.G.S.).

The dwelling is a well maintained frame building, dating from around 1840-60 composed of a three bay long, two story part with a six bay long, one and one-half story wing. The walls of the building are covered with plain weatherboard and all of the windows have 6/6 sash and louvered shutters.

At the corners of the two story part are paneled pilasters extending to a deep fascia beneath the eave. The side entrance has a pediment over the door which is a replacement of a small porch originally. In the north gable rises a brick chimney and flanking it are two four pane casements.

The long wing has the same roof ridge but the section adjoining the tall part is at a higher level thus making the windows, including the dormer, higher than the lower two-thirds of the building. Between the two parts is a seam in the weatherboard as well as a brick chimney.

Its plan consists of a parlor and stair hall in the tall part with den adjoining and the dining room and kitchen on the lower level. A screened porch opens on the west side of the lower rooms and off the south end of the porch is a small frame dairy. The stair balustrade is made of cherry and the railing of walnut. Beside the old floors little of antiquity remains in the remainder of the house.

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**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Long Point Farm is an important mid-19th century farmhouse which carries many aspects of farm life for that period. Not only is the house well maintained, it is essentially like it was originally, a back porch, dairy and smoke house all of which were important to the life style of the period.

The name "Long Point" is derived from the fact that the Tucka-hoe makes a horseshoe turn at the end of the property creating a long point of land. At one time there was a landing at the property.


