At the southwestern end of Tuckahoe Neck stands a late 18th Century vernacular frame dwelling, 1 1/2 stories tall. The 4-bay structure has a central stair passage and two rooms. Its principal room or "hall" has a wall of paneling across the fireplace composed of a series of raised panels above the fireplace flanked by tapered pilasters and raised panel cabinets. Original work exists in the passage but the remainder of the building has been damaged by years of neglect, fire, and the elements.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

At the southern end of Tuckahoe Neck on a dirt road called Schneider Road, stands a one and one-half story frame house sheathed with wooden shingles. It's southeast facade is four bays long with the entrance door in the second bay from the east. Old sash with 6/9 panes light the interior. On the steep 'A' roof, there are three 'A' roof dormers on each slope with 6/6 sash. At each gable is a chimney built outside the framework of the house, through the north-east chimney is a modern narrow block chimney. Also on the north-east is a door leading outside which once led to a kitchen. Part of the brick foundation has been renewed with blocks and the old pyramidal chimney on the southwest gable has a coat of cement.

Inside, the old doors and trim remain, as well as some raised paneling in the main room. Although it is occupied, the building is very deteriorated.

The interior of the building consists of a two room and central stair passage with comparable plan above. The living room is the most significant room of the house for it possesses very good woodwork consisting of a wall of raised paneling having reeded pilasters flanking the fireplace and paneled overmantel. Flanking the above are two cabinets with raised panel doors. Some chair rail and trim remain, however, it is all very deteriorated.

The stair passage has flush board walls and a sheathed stair with balustrade partly removed. beneath the stair is a closet. The other room and second story have nothing of antiquity remaining. According to hearsay, the roof burned off the building and was replaced.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This dwelling has some very significant late 18th century woodwork and is the chief reason for its being an important building in Caroline County. Few dwellings have such sophisticated woodwork, with pilasters and raised paneling. It is a plain vernacular structure, but its paneling aspires to great style, executed, however, in a vernacular manners.
