Circa 1797

South of Hickman is a handsome lone brick farmhouse two full stories in height which has been owned by the Noble family since the beginning. The present owner found a brick dated 1797 when remodeling. An early kitchen wing exists on the west gable and recent leanto additions exist on both sides of the latter and across the south side of the former. Originally there was a hall and parlor plan, but the remodeling changed the position of the stair and covered the exposed joists. This latter feature is more common to Caroline and Dorchester counties than elsewhere on the Shore.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Noble House is located on Noble Road, approximately one mile north of Maryland Route 404 in the vicinity of Hickman, Caroline County. According to the owner, a brick removed from the chimney of the house was inscribed 1797, presumably the year when the house was built.

The main section of the house is brick two stories with three bays on the first story and two bays on the second story. The north and south facades are Flemish bond with tooled joints and have a single brick belt course. The first story of both facades has a central doorway (the one on the north facade is presently blocked in) flanked on each side by a one over one sash window with single brick flat arch lintels. The second floor sash windows are centered between the first story bays. The gable ends are common bond and have interior end chimney stacks at the ridge and two small four pane windows. On the east gable end a one story frame kitchen is attached. The south facade has a one story enclosed porch running the full length of the brick house and along most of the kitchen wing. There is a wood box cornice.

According to the owner the interior ceilings were once exposed and whitewashed but are presently plastered over. The stair case has also been rearranged.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Noble House is a fine example of the rural Federal style architecture as found in Caroline County. The brick construction and symmetrical facade are a small scale attempt to resemble some of the high-style architecture of this period. The Noble House is representative of a fine tradition of farmhouse architecture during this period.


