STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The site of the Plains of Charles Dickenson is located at the curve of a dirt land that runs southeast from Back Land Road, approximately one-half mile from Maryland Route 331 and southwest of Linchester, Caroline County. It is the site of an early house and graveyard, reputedly the home of Charles Dickenson who was the father of the Charles Dickenson killed by Andrew Jackson.

A survey in 1970 showed that only a single tree remained from the graveyard site. Nearby was the rubble foundation of an early house. The site is adjacent to the Choptank River which was navigable in the eighteenth century.

The early survey further reports that the gravestones were removed by the owners and thrown away. One large plaque was the grave of Sophia Dickenson, wife of Charles.
