The Willis House is an interesting early dwelling composed of two sections of nearly equal size and date. In form the western portion, which appears earlier, is like the Noble House near Hickman. Its wing has no counterpart in Caroline, but is like Shady Side Farm, Talbot County. Its facade is two full stories, but the back is only one story.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Richard Willis house is located on the north side of Maryland Route 318, approximately one quarter mile west of Seippes Road, west of Federalsburg, Caroline County. From its exterior characteristics, the house appears to have been built in the mid to late nineteenth century.

The main section of the Richard Willis House is a two story frame structure on a brick foundation with an interior end brick chimney stack. The exterior is covered with beaded clapboard except for a section of the back of the brick chimney which is exposed to the second floor joists. This section is common bond and is painted white. The main facade (south elevation) of the structure has a central entrance with a one story, one bay porch and a pair of connected 6/1 pane sash windows to each side. The second story has two 6/6 pane sash windows, one centered above each pair of windows on the first story. There is a plain box cornice and a shingled gable roof. The north elevation has a full length enclosed leanto porch.

The east addition is also a two story frame structure, but has a lower pitch gable roof with a catslide in the rear covering a one story section whose north wall is even with the main section of the house. The south facade is asymmetrical with an off-center door flanked on each side by a 6/1 pane sash window, and two similar windows on the second story. There is an interior end brick chimney stack.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Richard Willis House is an example of a mid-nineteenth century farmhouse in Caroline County. The structure has the basic shape and form of regional farmhouse, but its awkward fenestration and plain ornamentation show a lack of concern for architectural embellishments.


