Its present condition, totally remodeled, is of little significance at the present time; however, in the future its former owner, Iral Duffin, may prove to be a significant personage in the history of farm machinery.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Williston Hotel is a large mid 19th century frame building, five bays long, two bay deep and two storys tall. Its plan was originally four rooms with central stair hall. Most of the plan remains, however, all exterior and interior trim has been renewed and only the white pine flooring appears to be original.

Its south facade, which overlooks part of the Potter Hall yard, has a Doric portico over three of the five bays. The north facade has only a small portico over its central door. Above the windows are cornices and the principal cornice has large dentils, both of which would be appropriate to the period of the building. On the west side is a one story addition with garage beneath.

It is very well maintained and beautifully landscaped.






