This was the site of Caroline County Government since 1797. The original structure was built in the Federal style with central block having symmetrical hyphens and wings. There is a tradition in Caroline that William Buckland, architect of Annapolis designed the first courthouse since he died in Caroline while discussing a design for a building in 1774. This seems untenable, unless he left a general scheme with the commissioners, and the scheme was built with stylistic detail of the Federal Period, twenty-three years later.

That building was removed when a portion of the present courthouse was built in 1895. The back of that building now exists behind the "Colonial" facade. The second courthouse was built in the Romanesque style and has many details in common with the Worcester County Courthouse at Snow Hill.

The third courthouse covered the facade of the Romanesque structure and increased the size considerably. It lacks the architectural sophistication which the two former buildings possessed.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Caroline County Courthouse is on the site of the first courthouse built in the county in 1797. The present structure from Market Street appears to be a 1966 Georgian style structure with three bay central pavillion with Doric pedimented portico. Besides the central part, are four bays on each side; the roof of the two storys terminates in a hip. It is a very plain typical Government building of recent years with little relation to the proportions of antique architecture.

From the center of the roof, however, rises a foreign element, a bellroofed tower. Each of its facades is divided into two panels by pilasters with dentil frieze above. In each panel is a lou-
vered opening with semicircular head. A clock is located in each facet of the bell shaped roof. A copper pinnacle rises from the apex of the roof. This element is what remains visible from Market Street. Behind the building is the remainder of the 1895 structure. It is three bays wide and four bays deep and has very tall proportions with this same type of details as on the tower. There is a granite basement and smooth brick above laid in all header bond. In each panel of the north section is a window on each story. The panel is divided into first and second storys by a band of molded brick. The two windows closest the new addition are within a single panel. Each window has segmental arches on the first story and semicircular arches on the second story, both having rough granite imposts and sills, and protruding brick arches. Two chimneys with gablet between rise above the center north entrance, one is also located adjacent the new wing on the east side. In each gable of the north section is a pediment of fish scale shingle.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Primarily the Caroline County Courthouse is important as the center of government since 1797. The structure which was built was a fine example of Federal architecture (or late Georgian) with a central block having symetrically placed hyphens and wings. There seems a possibility that the building was constructed after a design by William Buckland who died in Caroline County on his way to discuss the design with the county officials in 1774.

Architecturally, the second courthouse, built in 1895 was a very fine example of Romanesque design as made popular by architects such a H.H. Richardson. The building has many details similar to the Worcester County Courthouse, Snow Hill. A more appropriate enlargement of the building could have been accomplished by a close examination of the scale and lines of the original as was the case at Snow Hill.
