This house is like several dwellings in the vicinity of Wye Mills which were constructed in the 1880's; e.g., Dr. Hopkins House, Hassett Farm, Dolvin. Unlike the latter two, this house was built at one time and has been altered slightly, since it was built. It is a well-maintained building, now with apartments, which was constructed by William G. Horsey as a wedding gift for his daughter, Clara, who married George A. Deakyne.

"Originally the house stood closer to the northwest corner of the large and beautifully landscaped lot. It was moved back, off the corner, by the Staffords when they sold the corner itself for a commercial lot." (Horsey, E. F.)

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

12 Fifth Street, Denton, is a two story, Victorian style, ell shaped house. The main section is three bays wide. There is a one story columned porch with a short squat balustrade on the porch roof. The first story has a door to the west side with sidelights, transom, and shelf lintel. The other bays on both stories have 2/2 pane sash windows with green louvered shutters. On the roof are two gabled dormers. Chimney stacks are located at the gable end and at the ridge of the ell addition. Wood trim is of the period and includes columns, serpentine brackets with incised designs, and various porches, one of which is early twentieth century.

Presently the building has three apartments.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is like several dwellings in the vicinity of Wye Mills which were constructed in the 1880's, Dr. Hopkins House, Hassett Farm and Dolvin. Unlike the latter two, this house was built at one time and has changed very little over its ninety years. It is a well maintained dwelling which was built for an upper middle class family of the period and is significant for its original material and form as well as its position on the lot.


