The Goldsborough House is one of the largest and least altered dwellings in Greensboro. It is a large two-story frame structure with central entrance projecting from the facade like a tower. It resembles the "tower" on Plaindealing and Marengo, Talbot County. One side of the building was constructed for a vault by Judge Laird Goldsborough.

The house stands on six acres of Ingram's Desire, sold by Peregrine Pratt to William Turner for \$60 in 1817. In 1837, Turner sold 1/4 acre on which the house stands to Spencer Hitch for \$305. A portion of the building may date from that period. The building passed to the widow of S. Hitch and she in turn willed it to M. Hooper Gray and wife in 1884. They sold it in 1893 to Mary Booker for \$2,000, a price which suggests the main part of the building was constructed. In 1897, it was purchased by Dr. Griffin Goldsborough for \$2,100. In 1926, the grandchildren of Griffin sold it to one of their number, Judge W. Laird Goldsborough. After the death of "Miss Kitty, the judge's widow, the property passed to the Caroline County Historical Society." (Horse, E. F.)

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Goldsborough House is one of the largest and least altered dwellings in Greensboro. It is a large two story, frame structure, five bays long with central entrance on the facade. Like Plain-dealing, Denton and Marengo, Miles River Neck, the central bay of the second story and attic protrude to suggest a tower. On its second story are double windows and on the attic level are two smaller windows within a single frame. Its entire gable is covered with decorative shingles.

On the east side of the building is a one bay extension, two stories tall with nearly flat roof having a balustrade. On the north side is a two room long, one and one-half story addition and a lean-to addition. Across the Sunset Avenue facade and Church Street facade is a one story verandah with gable over the entrance. Its roof, like the main roof is covered with rairsed seam tin. The windows of the house have 2/2 sash and louvered shutters. Brick chimneys pierce the roofs in the usual positions for a house of this period.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Goldsborough House appears to have been constructed around the 1880's in the Victorian Gothic style. Part of the building is reputedly older, however, without an examination of the structure it would be difficult to determine. Whatever its age, the building is one of the least altered houses in the town and is well known because it was the home of Dr. Goldsborough a physician of the twentieth century, and respected citizen of the town.


