The form and fenestration of this mid-19th Century dwelling are common to vernacular buildings from the mid-18th Century into the 20th Century. Its rear wing with tiny second story windows close to the floor are more typical of late 19th Century farmhouses in Maryland.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ridgely-Greensboro Road House is located on the Ridgely-Greensboro Road approximately three-tenths of a mile west of Holly Road in the vicinity of Ridgely, Caroline County. The exterior of the house indicates that it is probably mid to late 19th century and since the house is vacant the interior evidence is presently unknown.

The Ridgely-Greensboro Road House has a two story, three bay main section with a four bay rear wing extending from the center of the south facade. The main facade faces north and has a central doorway with 2/2 pane sash windows in the other bays on both storys. The tin covered gable roof has interior end chimney stacks at both ends. The exterior is covered with a shiny type of formstone which combined with the metal supports give the house a distinct mid-20th century quality.

The rear wing is a story and a half frame structure with a central chimney. The west facade has a one story porch with turned columns extending the length of the wing. The first story has two doors and two 2/2 windows. Above the porch roof are two six pane windows lighting the half story. There is no indication that this wing is older than the main house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Little can be definitely determined without access to the interior of this dwelling. Its form and fenestration are common from the 18th century onward. The rear wing, however, is more typical of the late 19th century than the front part which appears earlier. It is probably the product of additions and alterations throughout the 19th century.


