Originally the dwelling now standing on Maryland Route 480 north of Hillsboro was a Quaker Meeting House. It was moved from Greensboro in this century and converted into a house. The lot on which the Meeting House stood was purchased by the Quakers in 1795. The building was built soon afterwards. (Horsey, E. F., Origins of Caroline County, Volume I, page 50).
