The former Caroline County High School is a two story, six bay wide brick building with a hip roof. Extending from the two center bays is a gable roofed entrance pavillion, the front end of which is covered with wooden shingles and pierced by a 9/6 segmental arch window. The round arch entrance has stone surrounds, keystone, and impost stone. The name "Caroline High School" is cut into the stone surround, while the date "1901" appears on the keystone.

Windows are uniformly 6/2 sash set within segmental arch openings. The original 3 panel doors with transom lights, corner lights and side lights still remain.

Alterations to the building include the filling in of the arched entry with temporary wood framing and plastic and the the removal of the bell tower which sat on the center roofline.




