

## Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Denton Armory is a two story brick structure with full basement situated on the southeastern edge of the town of Denton, at the corner of Maple and Randolph Streets. Across Maple Street (to the west) is a large open space with playground, and the surrounding area is given to mixed commercial and residential uses.

The Armory, completed in 1938 is oriented to the west. It is composed of one story, one-bay side sections flanking a three-bay center section. The side sections are identical and contain 6/4 casement windows under 6-pane horizontal strips. The windows have no trim except narrow stone sills.

The second section of the front facade projects slightly from the side sections. Strip buttresses with stone caps punctuate the bays. The bays flanking the center arched doorway contain windows at first floor level, 6/4 casement under a 6-pane horizontal strip, with narrow stone sills. At second floor level are windows, also 6/4 casement with stone sills. The center doorway is flanked by piers projecting slightly from the rest of the center.

The doorway block projects several inches from the rest of the facade center. Wide double doors under a slightly recessed pointed brick arch are flanked by 2/4 casement windows at the first floor level. Two rows of brick corbelling cross above the doorway. The corbelled section is surmounted by the letters "M N G" in gold attached to the wall. A band of stone molding crosses the center section immediately above the second floor windows.

Centered above the second floor window at second floor level are decorative slots. The roofline above is flat and untrimmed.

A brief flight of cement steps leads to the doorway from the sidewalk, and a low brick wall with cement trim lines the walkway to the street. The front walk along Maple Street is lined with tall shade trees.

The south and north sides of the center block are identical, with double 4/4 casement windows under 4-pane horizontal strips.

The rear one story drill hall over full basement is four bays long, with bays separated by strip buttresses ending with stone caps above the level of the window tops. The first floor windows are stationary panels of glass, four panes horizontally and 6 panes vertically with transom openings at their centers. The windows have stone sills. At basement level are two small windows per bay. The hall roof is hipped shaped and tiled. The north and south sides of the drill hall are identical except that the first bay of the south side has a canopied and attractively landscaped ground floor walkway leading to the basement entrance to the Caroline (County) Senior Center.

The five-bay rear wall of the drill hall is punctuated by strip buttresses with stone caps and windows as noted for the side elevations. A flight of steps with iron pipe railing leads to a double door entrance in the extreme southeast bay. At the southwest corner of the lot is a brick one story garage set inside a fenced triangular motor compound.

Significance Evaluated: state

The Denton, Maryland Armory is primarily significant for its association with the reorganization and expansion of the National Guard system in the twentieth century. It derives additional significance from its role as a social center for its community, a function it has served continuously since its construction date. Architecturally, the building embodies the distinctive characteristics of its type, including a T shaped plan with a two-story front "head house" section and a one-story perpendicular "drill hall" extending to the rear; its facade is detailed to recall Medieval fortifications, with towers flanking the central entrance, crenellated parapets, and strip buttresses. Although the Denton Armory is less than 50 years old, constructed in 1938, it is exceptionally significant for its association with the distinguished contribution of the Maryland National Guard in the second World War.

The Denton Armory, the ninth such structure to be built on Maryland's Eastern Shore, was completed in October, 1938 at a cost of \$50,000. The building was dedicated May 30, 1939 to the uses of the 104th Quartermaster's Company of the Maryland National Guard. As part of the 29th Division, the 104th shares in the honors bestowed upon the Division at the close of World War II, most notably the distinguished unit citation and the French Croix de Guerre with Palm.

The requests for bids for construction of the Armory were published in the Caroline Sun (now the County Record) beginning in April 1938. A \$50,000 limit was set, allowing \$45,000 for buildings costs and \$5,000 for architectural work and furnishings. In June of that year a construction contract was awarded to the Carlstrand Engineering Corporation of Baltimore, who offered to complete the building by October 1938 for a total of \$43,000.

The Denton Armory has served many community purposes over the years. The Denton unit of the National Guard has removed to a new armory on Route 404 between Denton and Centrevill which it shares with that town's Guard unit. The entire building is now occupied by Caroline County services. The basement level presently enjoys lively occupation by the Caroline Senior Center which has renovated the area to contain a cafeteria and cheerful game and meeting room. The first floor front is occupied by the offices of the Caroline County Health Department. The gymnasium is heavily used by Denton youth for basketball games. The second floor appears to be vacant.

The first floor front is occupied by the offices of the Caroline County Health Department. The gymnasium is heavily used by Denton youth for basketball games. The second floor appears to be vacant.

RECOMMENDATION: Continued mixed-use as senior center, County offices and youth recreation hall. This is a highly successful conversion from military to community use and could be used as a model for other armories where such conversion is contemplated. NOTE: Serious leaks in the gymnasium roof threaten the integrity of the structure and pose a hazard to the many active young people and elderly who utilize the building daily.







SECOND FLOOR PLAN








GROUND FLOOR PLAN
