NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION <p>Several hundred feet behind the large Italianate mansion, now called Sealark, stands a two story nineteenth century house with a <u>1 1/2</u> story log wing. The two story clapboard house is three bays wide and one bay deep, and consists of a single room with vestibule, fireplace, and winding stair. It has a shallow porch and the windows have louvered shutters. The log portion is two bays wide and one bay deep and also has one room with a winding stair. The room above has one dormer and one window on the gable-end. Behind the log wing is a one room, one story wing. The entire building is in poor condition.</p>		3.
