Outside the southern limits of Cecilton, on Route 213, stands a three story nineteenth century house. It is five bays wide and one room deep and has a two story wing, four bays long, on the southeast. The frame building is covered with clapboard and the corners have a pilaster treatment which is repeated in the columns of the one story front porch. The cornice contains the gutters. The chimneys, within the building, have bold caps. The roof is a flat hipped roof of tin. The entrance has double doors with sidelights and transom. All windows have louvered shutters. The sash are 6/6 on the first and second floors and 3/3 on the third floor.

To the south of the house is a board and batten out-building with strap hinges on the single door. It was probably a smokehouse.
