This 2-1/2 story dwelling has a gently sloping A-roof and is four bays wide and one room deep. It has Flemish bond brick construction on the front and common bond sides and rear. The first floor windows are 6/9 while those on the second floor are 6/6. The front door occupies the second bay from the left. There are flat brick arches over all the windows. The door is topped by a Federal fanlight and is molded nicely. Between the first and second stories on the front of the house is a four string belt-course. The top row of bricks in the belt course protrudes slightly. There is an enclosed chimney at each end of the house. A tiny corner staircase winds up from the basement to the attic of the house.

This is a pleasing small house which has just recently been ~~exportly~~ restored. Its proportions and location make it attractive, and its detail is better than that found on other houses of the period and type in Cecil County.
