The Barnes house consists of a early stone gambrel roof house and a later two story frame house. The stone portion is three bays long with the door on the east side of each facade. It is only one room deep. On each side of the roof is a flat headed dormer and the chimney is within the west gable. The sash through-out is 6/6. The second floor joists are exposed on the exterior (perhaps meant to be boxed in.)

## PACA HOUSE

Lot #81

The earliest extant deed for this house is dated 31 October 1753, when John Paca, gentleman, of Baltimore, and Margaret, his wife, sold the property to Edward Mitchell, a Commissioner of Charlestown. John Paca was the father of William Paca, signer of the Declaration of Independence and the first Governor of Maryland. The frame section of this house is the oldest part, is partly of log construction, the stone end having been added circa 1750.

Present owners are Mr. and Mrs. Richard Barnes.
