NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC no <p>The McCool House is a double dwelling probably connected with the milling industry along the Little Elk Creek, as there are two other double houses in the immediate vicinity. The difference in this building is the placement of the door between two windows on each side of the huge central chimney which serviced both homes. The other buildings in the area have two doors in center of the building with end chimneys. The sash of the windows on the first story are 6/6 and those of the second story are 3/6. The stone is painted white. There is a lean-to addition on the north side of the house. The wood cornice has shaped end boards.</p>
