Section 7.1

The Barn Complex is located in Cecil County, within the Fair Hill N.R.M.A., and off of the dirt access road. It is to the west of Big Elk Creek, south of the Mason-Dixon line, north of Maryland route 273, and east of Maryland route 213. The Finley Property (Fair Hill Nature Center) is directly accross the road. There are numerous sheds on site, as well as, a large feed barn with silos lining the north facade.

The sheds are large, wood frame constructed, with shed doors on the gable ends. The exterior facades and roof have a covering of sheet metal siding. The sheds are arranged side by side with about a 20 foot space between them that allows for proper air circulation and access. On the ridge of the roof are skylights to let in natural light, which are the only windows present. The area surrounding the sheds is covered with asphalt.

The Feed Barn is two and one-half stories tall, with a one story addition on the east facade. Shed roofed side additions are present on both the north and south facades. All along the north facade are three story metal grain silos. The Feed Barn is constructed of wood framing with an exterior covering of sheet metal siding, similar to the siding on the sheds. The roof, on the other hand, has a covering of tin with vents on the ridge. Fixed, 6 paned windows are present in a line; directly under the eaves. The east facade has a portion of the building that slightly rises above the rest of the structure.

The buildings are still in use and appear to be in good condition.

This Barn Complex appears to date from the early to mid Twentieth century and is significant for its role in the farming industry of the Fair Hill area. The structures were originally used as a feed mill to process and store grain. They are still in use now, with the hay that is grown in the Management Area stored in the buildings after harvest. This hay is then sold, later in the year, to equestrians and farmers.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Finley barn is built of stone rubble with ashlar coins, and of heavy timber framing with board and batten walls. The major portion of the structure has stone walls on three sides, east and west, and on the north, which is the major access wall supporting a gable roof with E-W ridge, board and batten gable ends. On the south, the lines of the stone walls extended on heavy timber beams to cover a deep mow, with a heavy timber board and batten extension above with a shed roof to the main gable supported on fieldstone piers (four) the central two having wooden shoulders. The major storey is the upper, which is reached on the north via an earth ramp with stone revetments, which leads to a bridge over a dug out portion of the bank to the north of the wall (also retained by stone walls) giving northern access to the lower floor as well. The bridge is board and batten on heavy frame, and is roofed with a cross gable to the main gable roof. On the lower floor there are three non-original openings on the east wall, a small round arch door with brick header arch, and two modern garage doors.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This barn is associated with the Finley stone house (CE-301), and is located near it and the caretakers house on the former William DuPont estate. Local tradition gives the barn a date of mid-18th century, and there is no evidence at this time to either substantiate or deny the claim. The original stone walls are certainly very old, and significant in that they enclose most of the barn, rather than serving simply as end walls. The board and batten addition on the south is certainly of a late 19th century type, as is the comparable entrance bay on the north. The heavy-timber framing, mortised and tenon, pegged with tree nails, is in very good condition, but again, is of a 19th century type. The barn is very similar to that associated with the Beers house (C-300) nearby, including the configuration of the very deep mow with frame loft above, supported on stone piers with wooden shoulders, and the entrance bridge, allowing access to the lower floor from the uphill side. The Beers barn has a stone plaque which bears the date 1826.


