An early deed for this property mentions the existence of a house built in the Dutch fashion, which means, in this case, a German half-timbered dwelling. It is believed that this building either burned or was somehow destroyed and on the remaining foundation was built the present structure around 1810. The basement still retains its colonial kitchen fireplace. In 1802 it was bought by Jeremiah Collins from the State of Maryland, which seems to indicate that it had belonged to a Tory and was seized by the State during the Revolutionary War. In 1881 it was bought by the Methodist Episcopal Church and used as their parsonage until recently.

It is presently owned and under reconstruction by Colonial Charlestown, Inc.

This frame house, clapboard covered by asphalt shingles, is L shaped, 3 bays by 1, facing north, the wing running south along the west wall, 1 bay tall.

Two stories over a lighted stone basement, the pitched roof/ridgeline of the main house runs east-west. Windows have 6 lights each. A large chimney rises in the west end wall.
