DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Foard Funeral Home is a large 20th century commercial structure converted into a funeral establishment. It is three bays wide and two bays deep and stands upon a concrete block cellar. At the corners of the building are brick piers which extend the two storys to the overhanging eave of the hip roof. There are three other brick piers which rise to the second floor level, two flanking the former entrance and one beside the north door of the west facade. Around the recessed, former entrance, which carries the sign of the establishment, is a strip of lattice. Flanking the former entrance are large windows. A cornice extends across the facade above the windows. A modern entrance porch in front of the north door has lattice posts. On the second story of the facade the wall is covered with pressed tin in imitation of rough concrete block. There are three pair of 1/1 light windows. The same tin siding is used on both storys of the sides, although the fenestration is irregular. On the south side is the entrance to the cellar.

There are additions on the east side of the building, some of which appear contemporary with the front.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Architecturally, the Foard Funeral Home is comparable with other buildings in town constructed for the purpose of commercial enterprises. Its simplicity is comparable to the Post Office (formerly Sawtelle's Drug Store) but the tin siding is like the Rees Store.

When Clinton and Leroy Foard bought this property for their store Foard Brothers Hardware, the title was very involved, having been a part of Mary Sophia Bayard's estate. One early reference calls the property "Spa Springs Park", although the spring itself is south of the town limits. The property was inherited from Mary Sophia by her daughters and grandchildren who were scattered around the world. One inheritor had married an English gentleman and is referred to as Lady Crooke.

The hardware store occupied this building for many years as Foard's Hardware. A small house on the corner of the lot was removed to provide parking space. A funeral home is now maintained at this location by a son of Leroy Foard.
