DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The fifth house south of Second Street on the east side of Charles Street is a twentieth century frame structure covered with tan ersatz brick. Along the first story of the facade is a hip roof porch which has been enclosed and now possesses four 1/1 sash windows and a center door. The porch is covered with another type of asphalt siding. On the second story facade are two 1/1 sash windows. Each gable has a window on both storys. The 'A' roof is covered with green asphalt and has no overhang at the eaves.

Behind the main body of the house is a two story wing with leanto on the south side.

Between this house and the south neighbor is a privet hedge. On the north is a picket fence.
