**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Marshall Bailey House is a two-story stone house built at two separate times. The earliest section dates from the 18th century and was owned by William Bailey in 1790. It is two bays by two with a stucco covering. The original door has been removed but it is in a nearby springhouse. It is a board-and-batten door built with beaded boards and handmade nails. The fireplace was located in the last gable but has been taken down.

The newer section was built in 1840 also of stone with a chimney in the west gable. There are built-in cupboards over the fireplace and chimney breast. In the attic of the newer side is a date in the east gable.

A small stone two-story springhouse is situated two hundred feet south east of the house. The upper story has an entrance in the west gable and the lower story has one midway in the foundation. Also of interest is a two-story frame outbuilding built of mortice and tenon construction.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house could have been built in the 18th century by the Bailey family, the original settlers. The property has been used as a farm for 275 years.

The Marshall's have deeds dating from 1790, 1801, 1838 and a plat map of 1837. In the attic is a box E.G. Chandlee Port Depoint, Maryland. The Chandlee's were early clockmakers.
