The church property includes the original 1742 brick church, a twentieth-century brick vestry, the churchyard, and the cemetery. The Colonial church is locally celebrated as being the second oldest parish in Maryland and the oldest extant non-residential structure in North East. The church and vestry are similar in style and materials giving the property a unified appearance. The cemetery with eighteenth century graves extends west to the North East River. The impressive property is one of the oldest and most important in North East having been the nucleus around which the town developed.

The St. Mary Anne's Church is recommended eligible under National Register Criteria A and C as well as under Criteria Consideration A. The church is an excellent example of a Colonial-era religious structure with very few additions or alterations. The 1904 bell tower addition was designed to compliment the church's architecture. The history of the structure is significant. Its 1742 construction makes it one of the earliest remaining churches within the county and the oldest extant non-residential building in North East. The church's association with Queen Anne of England, from whom it received its charter and religious ceremonial artifacts, gives it a significant tie to the British crown. The church's pure architectural lines, age, and interesting history make it one of North East's most significant and treasured structures.

DESCRIPTION:

The St. Mary Anne's Church is located within the NR-eligible North East Historic District (CE-1525) of which it is a contributing member. The church property is located on the northwest corner of South Main Street (MD Route 272) and Church Point Road in the mid-eighteenth-century Chesapeake Bay town of North East. The property extends west from Main Street back to the North East River and includes the original 1742 brick church, a twentieth-century brick vestry, the churchyard, and the cemetery. The Colonial-era church is locally celebrated as being the second oldest parish in Maryland and the oldest extant non-residential structure in North East. The church and later vestry are similar in style and materials giving the property a unified appearance. The cemetery, with marked graves dating to the late eighteenth century, extends west out to the river. The impressive property is one of the oldest and most important in North East having been the nucleus around which the town developed.

SIGNIFICANCE:

The St. Mary Anne's Church is recommended eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A and C as well as under Criteria Consideration A. From an architectural standpoint, the church is an excellent example of an early Colonial-era religious structure with very few additions or alterations. The 1904 bell tower addition is in itself historic and was designed to compliment the church's architecture. The history of the structure is locally as well as regionally significant, and for this reason it is recommended eligible under Criterion C and Criteria Consideration A. Its construction in 1742 makes it one of the earliest remaining churches within the county and the oldest extant non-residential building in North East. The church's association with Queen Anne of England, from whom it received its charter and religious ceremonial artifacts, give it a significant tie to the British crown. The church's pure architectural lines, mid-eighteenth-century age, and interesting history make it one of North East's most significant and treasured structures.

The St. Mary Anne's Church is located within the NR-eligible North East Historic District (CE-1525) of which it is a contributing member. The church property is located on the northwest corner of South Main Street (MD Route 272) and Church Point Road in the mid-eighteenth-century Chesapeake Bay town of North East. The property extends west from the main street back to the North East River and includes the original 1742 brick church, a twentieth-century brick vestry, the churchyard, and the original cemetery. The Colonial-era church is locally celebrated as being the second oldest parish in Maryland and the oldest extant non-residential structure in North East. The church and later vestry are similar in style and materials giving the property a unified appearance. The cemetery, with marked graves dating to the late eighteenth century, extends west out to the river. The impressive property is one of the oldest and most important in North East having been the nucleus around which the town developed.

The St. Mary Anne's Church is located on the west side of Main Street, south of the downtown commercial district. The property is encircled by a high stone wall with iron gates. The church sits on the eastern portion of the property with its façade fronting south on Church Point Road. The church building is one-and-a-half stories high and five bays wide constructed of Flemish bond brickwork. The shingled roof is gambrel with clipped gables and flared ends. Decorative elements of the unpretentious structure include the original arched paneled shutters, an unusual brick stringcourse over the doorways, and two small stained-glass windows (one on western elevation above door; one on southern elevation above door in bell tower). Compass-headed windows with double-hung eight-over-eight sash are topped by an arched four-pane transom, giving the window an appearance of a twelve-over-eight sash. The southern side entrance was altered in the early twentieth century with the addition of a two-story bell tower in 1904. The Georgian Revival tower features an octagonal cupola with the bell, small multi-pane circular windows below the cupola, and double entry doors under a decorative fanlight. The bell tower, constructed in memory of Richard Brookings by his son Robert, perfectly compliments the building's simple architecture. A dedication plaque is located above the double entry.

Despite the bell tower's formal entry, the primary entry of the church is located on the western gable end. This simple arched entry is topped by a beautiful oval Tiffany stained-glass window and flanked by two windows. The interior of the church is also unpretentious with the choir loft on the western wall over the entrance and the altar on the eastern wall facing Main Street. The Reverend Joseph Coudon, rector at St. Mary Anne's from 1787-92 and the first ordained Episcopal clergyman in the new country, is buried on the south side of altar within the church (Miller 1949:79).

The vestry is located adjacent to the church to the west with a concrete walkway linking the buildings. The vestry was constructed in the 1960s in a style complimentary to the church's architecture. The building is a small one-and-a-half-story, single-bay structure of brick with a pent roof on the gable ends. Windows on the side elevations are double-hung six-over-nine sash. The interior of the building is simple with woodwork and plastered walls that mirror that of the older church. The vestry consists of a core meeting room with a smaller adjacent changing room.

The cemetery encircles the church on all directions. The older portions of the cemetery are located within the immediate churchyard with more recent burials fanning out and extending west toward the North East River. A section of crude unscribed stones is located off the western side of the vestry. Local history states that the churchyard holds many graves of the early Susquehannocks as well as unmarked graves of early colonists, indicating that the plot was the sight of burials as early as the seventeenth century (Miller 1949:79). Members of many of the area's earliest and most prominent families are buried in the churchyard. The cemetery has been continually used for burials up through the twentieth century.

The 1904 bell tower addition is in itself historic and was designed to compliment the church's architecture. The history of the structure is locally as well as regionally significant, and for this reason it is recommended eligible under Criterion C and Criteria Consideration A. Its construction in 1742 makes it one of the earliest remaining churches within the county and the oldest extant non-residential building in North East. The church's association with Queen Anne of England, from whom it received its charter and religious ceremonial artifacts, give it a significant tie to the British crown. The church's pure architectural lines, mid-eighteenth-century age, and interesting history make it one of North East's most significant and treasured structures.

Prior to the colonial inhabitation of the east bank of the North East River in the area of North East, Native American Susquehannocks hunted and fished the land. By the latter part of the seventeenth century, the Shawanese established a village along the river in the southern part of the current North East borough (Four Water Front Towns 1938). Colonial settlement in the area began in the early eighteenth century. To meet the religious needs of the growing population, the General Assembly passed an act erecting the parish of North Elk in 1706 (Johnston 1989:217). The North Elk Parish encompassed the part of the county north of the Elk River and east of the Susquehanna River. A log church was constructed in the area along the road south to Turkey Point. This early church, named St. Mary's, served a mixed population of different religions and had only an annual revenue of about 40£ (Johnston 1989:217). A petition to England's Queen Anne for money and a preacher resulted in her gift of a large Bible (printed at Oxford in 1716 by John Baskett, printer to the King's Most Excellent Majesty and the University), a prayer book, and a silver communion service (made in London by Folkingham in 1717) (Miller 1949:79). In appreciation, the parish renamed the church, St. Mary Anne's.

In 1742, an act authorizing an 800£ levy was passed that enabled the parish to erect a permanent church and vestryhouse. The new church, the current structure, was built on the same property as the original church. A local history suggests that Samuel Gilpin may have done the carpentry work on both buildings since payment records to Gilpin were found in early church records (Johnston 1989:220). The interrelated disciplines of religion and education were combined through the opening of a school in the vestryhouse by Donminie Fanning in 1752.

In 1904, Robert Brookings erected a bell tower on the church's southern elevation in memory of his father S. Richard Brookings. The bell tower, which formed the church's new entry, was constructed in a Georgian Revival style that complimented the colonial architecture of the original structure. A dedication plaque, located above the double entry doors, reads: "To the glory of God and in memory of S. Richard Brookings, this tower is erected by his son Robert S. Brookings, A.D. 1904".

The significance of the church's architecture was recognized in 1936 with its documentation for the Historic American Building Survey (HABS) (Blumgart 1996:378)..

Containing an area of approximately 2.5 acres.

The boundary description was drawn to include the southern portion of Tax Parcel 257, north of Church Point Road, on Cecil County Tax Map 401. The boundary was drawn to encompass the church, vestry, and cemetery associated with this property.



This brick church has a graceful gambrel roof flaring at the base under a hip roof, or jerkin roof. Of strongly ~~patterned~~ Flemish bond, 5 bays by 2, one story high, windows are arched with shutters in the round arch over double hung windows 8 lights over 8.

Oblong, the entrance is in the center of the long south wall under a belfry added in 1904. Another door is in the west end ~~west~~ wall under a gallery lighted by an oval window of Tiffany glass. The gallery now houses the organ.

The church has a lofty barrel vault. Woodwork is simply executed.

A small brick vestry lies to the west of the church, beautifully built in the 1960's of Flemish bond brick, 2 bays x 1, under a pitched roof, pedimented. A large fireplace is in the west end wall.




