 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The first dwelling to be seen on approaching the district is the Mackey House. It is a two bay wide, two story frame dwelling with two story wing on the east having a south porch. The building is very neat and is exemplary for the approach to the town.

The walls are covered with white weatherboard and the trim is painted dark green. Its entrance is located on the northern side of the west facade. All the windows have 2/2 sash. There is a west porch with balustrade and turned posts, but the pierced brackets have been removed. Its roof contains the gutter and, like the main roof is covered with raised seam tin painted aluminum. A brick chimney rises within the south gable.

Unlike many of the porches in the area, the south porch is still partially open and presents a pleasing site upon approaching the town.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Architecturally this building forecasts the form and scale of the majority of buildings in Chesapeake City. Its location and condition contribute to its importance as the gateway to the Historic District of Chesapeake City.

This is the first house the visitor sees on entering the Historic District of Chesapeake City. It is a well maintained property, obviously in the possession of a proud owner. Built about 1904, the house has changed owners only three times. South of this property is Spa Spring Park, a one time campground and picnic area. In the early 1900's there was a dance pavilion in the park.


