DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This building appears to be the earliest in the block for it retains original window trim on the second story and the cornice.

Like the other buildings in the block, it is a two bay wide structure with a two story wing and a one story shed addition. The walls of the entire structure are covered with tan asphalt shingle and the roof is covered with red asphalt shingle.

The first story of the George Street facade lacks a porch and apparently has been remodeled at some time for commercial pursuits. There is a recessed entrance on the south bay along side of a plate glass window. The second story windows have 6/6 panes.

Facing the Canal is a secondary entrance on the wing with small hooded porch with crude balustrade and posts. A pair of windows light the first story of the gable end. Being the second lot from the Canal and there being no building in the first lot, this house has more appeal than any of the neighboring buildings. It is one of the key properties on the street and care should be taken to try to restore its exterior as it is a focal point for the street.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house on the west side of George Street next to the Canal was formerly the sixth building away from the waterway. A movie theater was next to this house; an empty lot was next where a house had been demolished; the barbershop was the next building; then came another vacant lot; and next to the water was a house. These buildings stood until the bridge was changed and the Canal widened in 1940. Now the occupants of this house have an unrestricted view of canal traffic, the bridge, and the northern part of town.

The front part of this house served as a shoe shop for many years. New shoes were sold here and old shoes were repaired.

The only significance this property has in the overall picture of Chesapeake City is as an example of the small businesses that existed in homes located near the Canal and the mainstream of traffic. John Chandler, the original lessee, was a sailor. In April, 1854, his lease was "rendered null and void by the failure of the said lessee to pay the rent for one year". The lease reverted to the Richard Bayard estate.




