DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Providence Boarding House is a large frame building of Victorian (vernacular) style. It is two and a half stories in height and is three bays long by two bays deep. Off the rear of the building is a two story wing. The house has a gable roof with inside end chimneys made of bricks. In the center of the roof on the facade of the house is a peaked dormer with a lancet type window. The peak of the dormer has some plain wooden gingerbread beneath it. The center bay of the facade houses the front entrance which has a two light transom. Also on the facade is a one story porch with turned porch posts with connections of railing. The underneath of the porch is hidden by wooden lattice, work. All of the window frames are capped and the sash consists of two over two sash. The house has a stone foundation and a cellar. The rear wing is of similiar construction with like weatherboard siding.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Providence Boarding House was the dwelling of a man who worked in the nearby paper mill and rented rooms out of his house to other mill workers. The house was used as a boarding facility during the late 1800's and early 1900's. It is a plain structure of no singular architectural merit. It does contribute to the early mill community setting.
