**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Spratt House is a building that consists of two structures built side by side. The earlier of the two has the date 1802 in the chimney in the west gable end. It is built of stone and is two stories in height with a cellar. The walls are stuccoed. It is three bays long by two deep. The facade has a central door and a one-story porch supported by wooden columns. The gable roof has asphalt shingles and a box cornice. The window sash on the first story are 6/3 and 3/6 on the second floor.

To the west and butted against the stone building is another two story frame structure with clapboard siding. On both houses the cellar is exposed with doors. The frame side has 6/6 sash with louvered shutters. In the west gable is a small brick stone chimney. This section is two bays long by two bays wide. The roof is covered with wooden shingles. The first story has a one-story front porch.

A small stone spring house and frame barn are also on the property.
