DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Boyle-Yeatman House c. 1856 is a 2 story frame house located on the west side of Route 222 just north of the Oakwood Road. The house has a north/south axis with the main facade having an eastern exposure.

The main block is 3 bays across by 2 deep and is supported by a full uncoursed stone foundation. A 20th century 2 story shed addition with block foundation extends across the west side of the structure. The asphalt tile roof is of medium slope with interior stretcher bond brick chimneys in each gable end.

The east (main) facade has a central entrance with a four panel front door. The window fenestration is symmetrical, and all but one 6/6 sash is replaced with single pane sash window. The older weatherboard siding has been covered with aluminum siding. There are two basement windows that flank the main entrance. The eaves are extended and the soffits sloped.

The south side of the house has 2 windows on each floor with two attic windows that flank the chimney stack. There is also an exterior basement entrance.

The other sides have similar detailing.

The interior has been fairly well remodeled except for the basement which has a brick fireplace with arched opening, and wrought iron fireplace crane. The floor joists are rough hewn with vertical saw marks.


