The farmhouse is a combination of two two story two bay by one room frame structures with a shed addition across the back and a shed porch attached to the front of the house.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Keithley-Reynolds House c. 1860-1877 is a 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> story frame house built in two sections. One structure 2 bays across by 1 room deep was built first with a similar addition attached to the east gable end of the structure. The main facade faces south with the primary gable running east/west. Shed roof extensions are found on both north and south sides.

The main block rests on an uncoursed stone foundation and is covered with asbestos siding. The roof is of medium pitch with a slate covering.

The south facade is a total of 4 bays across with a door in the second bay from the west. The trim is plain. The window sash is 1/1. A later box cornice has been ~~added~~ added. The front porch roof is supported by pier supports with scroll brackets.
